### Advent - A Time of Hope

Resumption of Mass: The Government has announced special concessions with regard to religious services at level 3 which will be reviewed in January.

This allows up to 50 people to attend Mass with the following measures in place: 2metre social distancing - members of the same household should sit together

- Face coverings must be worn
- Gathering outside of church before or after Mass is not permitted. ٠
- The building must be well-ventilated. ٠
- You can help us to allow as many people as possible to attend Sunday Mass by attending only one mass at the weekend - this frees up space for others. Thank you for your help.

Funerals and Weddings are still limited to 25 people – please respect this number. Christmas Mass Arrangements: The Parish Pastoral Council will be meeting during the coming week to discuss Christmas arrangements. Although churches are now open for liturgies, there is a limit of 50 people which will have a clear impact on our Christmas celebrations.
