

Resumption of Mass: This allows up to 50 people to attend Mass with the following measures in place:

- 2metre social distancing members of the same household should sit together
- Face coverings must be worn
- Gathering outside of church before or after Mass is not permitted.
- The building must be well-ventilated.
- You can help us to allow as many people as possible to attend Sunday Mass by attending only one mass at the weekend - this frees up space for others. Thank you for your help.

Funerals and Weddings are still limited to 25 people – please respect this number.

Mass times for Christmas are as follows:

**Christmas Eve:** No Morning Mass in St Molua's; 4pm Mass in O'Gonnelloe GAA grounds carpark. This is drive-in only to help us comply with Covid19 restrictions; please stay in your cars and follow the directions of the stewards. Prayer Around the Crib at 6pm; this liturgy is online only and will be broadcast from Bodyke. It will be a very special ceremony especially for families and you are encouraged to watch it as you gather with family by your crib.

Christmas Day: 9am St Molua's, 10:30am St Mary's; Masses are restricted to 50 people and stewards will be taking names after Masses this weekend. Apologies that we cannot accommodate everyone at our Christmas liturgies; unfortunately current restrictions on capacity mean that we cannot have more than 50 people in the church for mass or other liturgies (25 for funerals and weddings). Please help us to allow as many as possible to attend Mass by attending only one Mass over the Christmas season.
