Guidelines on the easing of restrictions were due to be announced after this newsletter had been printed; the expectation is that public attendance at Mass will resume shortly with similar protocols in place as before Christmas. How this will affect our local celebrations will be announced at Mass online so please tune in to that and to our website for further information. Thanks to everyone for your co-operation and understanding at this time.

Sacraments: Once the source for details of any celebrations of the sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation that will be permitted; families will also be contacted directly through schools with details.

Pastoral Council: The Parish Pastoral Council met during the week and reviewed the great work that has been carried out in extending the new cemetery. It is almost completed with just some minor works to be carried out. Graves are available for purchase and those who have bought graves will be contacted in the coming weeks with details regarding the site. Grateful appreciation was expressed to all those involved in the work and their generosity of labour which helped to keep the costs down was acknowledged and very much appreciated. The burial ground was formally consecrated by Fr David on Tuesday evening but it is important to note that every grave is blessed as part of the Catholic burial rite. Work on St Molua's is due to begin in the next number of weeks; the restrictions on construction had delayed these works but we hope they will be completed shortly.

Online Mass: is broadcast online each morning at 10am, except Saturdays. It can be accessed through the parish website or Facebook page 'Bodyke Church'. It is good to see so many joining us for online Mass and thanks for all the lovely comments that are made. Replies are not made to comments or messages sent via online mass.

To watch Mass online from Bodyke church

- Go to www.bodyketuamgraneyparish.ie, Scroll to the section 'Notices & Events' and go to the notice 'Bodyke Church Live Services'. In that notice click the link 'BodykeChurch' which will take you to the live service and you will also be able to see previously broadcast Masses. You do not need a Facebook account to watch the Mass.
- If you do have a Facebook account follow the 'Bodyke Church' page which will bring you to online Masses.
- The broadcast usually begins about five minutes before Mass is due to begin. You can watch the mass later during the day at the same site.
