Community/Local News

O'Gonnelloe Community Development Plan: A 3-Year Community Development Plan for O'Gonnelloe, in preparation over the last eighteen months, is now available in draft form. This marks the final stages in a consultative process that began in 2019 with the circulation of a questionnaire to every household. A total of 146 completed questionnaires were returned and the results informed the development of the plan. The process was led by a group of local volunteers working closely with a facilitator appointed by Clare Local Development Company. Copies of the draft plan and a summary are being emailed to as many people as possible. Printed versions are available in the porches at both churches for those who would like paper copies. The planning group would be delighted if people would fill in a response sheet, found at the back of the documents, and send it by email to ogonnelloecommunity@gmail.com or drop it into the Parish Office at the Community Centre marking the envelope 'Community Development Plan'. Please complete and return the response sheet on or before Friday, April 30. All responses will be reviewed and the draft plan will be adjusted where possible to reflect them. A final version of the 3-Year Community Plan will then be circulated to all. Spring Clean: We are planning to do a tidy-up of the footpath on Saturday 24 April, from 9.30 to 12.00, as part of the National Spring Clean, promoted by An Taisce. Because of Covid government restrictions, we cannot meet as a large group (of more than 2 households), but we can work in small groups, or pairs, etc. Please wear a high vis vest or jacket and in order to keep safe, please pay attention to traffic on the road which travels at speed and please stay on the footpath. Feel free to pick any section of the footpath anywhere between Raheen and Two Mile Gate. We will be collecting litter, tidying up briars and grass and sweeping soil off the path. Please bring gloves, secateurs/clippers/loppers, a leaf blower if you have one, brush for sweeping. Anna McElhinney has registered our clean up with An Taisce and she has bags for collecting litter and some gloves, which she will leave in a box at the National School gate on Saturday morning, that you can collect. We will arrange for full bags to be collected from the footpath at lunchtime on Saturday 24th and taken to the Scariff recycling centre, so please leave full bags clearly visible and they will be picked up. Thank you for taking part in the Spring Clean and for helping to keep the footpath tidy and accessible to all. Feel free to do this work at a different time if this Saturday morning is not suitable for you.
