Blessing of Graves: will take place on this Sunday 6th November. Killin Children's Burial Ground after 11am Mass, New Cemetery directly afterwards, Gate Cemetery at 12:45pm, Hill Cemetery 1:45pm. Please let those know who are not living in Ogonnelloe.

7th/8th/9th November: There will be no masses in O'Gonnelloe, Bodyke/Tuamgraney. You are invited to attend mass in Scariff Church at 10am on those days. The Priests of the diocese will be on annual diocesan in-service in Loughrea from Sunday evening November 6th to Wednesday lunch time November 9th. A panel of retired priests have kindly agreed to provide emergency cover during these days, should the need arise.

Remembrance Mass: will take place on Saturday 12th November in St Molua's 8pm for all those within or from our community, who have passed away in the last year.

Remembrance Tree: You are invited to put the names of your deceased loved ones on the leaves provided and hang them on the Remembrance Trees, which will be in both churches during the month of November. This will be a reminder to all of us to remember and pray for the deceased at this very special time of the year.

Family Mass: will take place on Sunday, 20th November at 11am in St Mary's and will continue on the 3rd Sunday each month. Everyone is welcome. Please text the Parish phone on 0858779113 before 10th November if your child would like to take part e.g. reading, saying a prayer, being part of the offertory procession, playing music or singing. Older siblings, parents and grandparents are welcome to accompany a child in these activities. As November is the month of remembrance, we invite everyone to bring a leaf (any kind, paper or real!) with the name of a loved one who has died, and children will be asked to bring these to the altar during the mass. After mass there's an opportunity to meet each other and visit the Christmas Craft Fair in the Hall for local crafts and treats.
